The Church Year, begins with the First Sunday of Advent (the preparation for Christmas) through to the Last Sunday after Pentecost.

The Liturgical Calendar is divided into 3-year cycles: Year A, Year B & Year C. This allows us to hear the Word of the Lord, through the Old and New Testaments, the Psalms and the Gospels, in a familiar rhythm that exposes us to as many authors within the Holy Bible as possible.

Each year is divided into Seasons: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost & The season after Pentecost, which is the single longest season.

Each Sunday, there is a Bulletin that contains that week's assigned readings from the Old and New Testaments, the Psalms and the Holy Gospels.

ALL HYMNS are in the Blue Hymnal in each pew.
